URGENT MISSION

Dear Friend,

On a severely cold night, in the middle of the winter, a homeless man named Doyle nearly froze to death on the streets of Dayton. His legs were badly frostbitten. Police found him the next day and took him to the hospital where they had to amputate his legs below the knees.

Cindi and I were called to come and pray for Doyle in the intensive care unit at Miami Valley Hospital. When we got to the ICU he was in terrible pain and could not speak (because they had done a tracheotomy on him). We fought back our tears and shared the gospel with him as he listened carefully.

When I asked him if he wanted to accept Christ, big tears rolled down his rough face and he nodded yes. We led him in prayer and then did our best to comfort him with our visits for the next several days... before he died.

We only knew Doyle for a short time, but his suffering filled our hearts with deep compassion for homeless people in the winter.

Even now, years later, his story fills my eyes with tears and reminds me that winter brings increased hardship, suffering and danger to poor and homeless people! *continued* >

As the weather turns cold, poor and homeless people URGENTLY need our help to survive. They don't have thermostats to turn up the heat, or homes to stay warm in. They don't have warm cars to get around in. They don't have dresser drawers from which to pull dry socks or closets to go to for winter coats, hats and gloves.

But thanks be to God, they have us! Because God has put His love in our hearts for them. And He has provided this ministry for them, and partners like you who make it all possible.



Six days a week we are here for them! We give them a place of refuge to

come and get warm. We give them free cups of hot coffee on those cold winter mornings. We give them free hot meals to keep them going for another day or night in the cold. And we give them the dry socks, gloves, hats, rain ponchos, blankets and winter coats they need to survive.

Doug, who was homeless for 7 years, spent many

nights in a downtown parking garage sleeping under cardboard boxes to try and stay warm. Sometimes he had to rub his feet all night to keep from getting frostbite. He said, "I would not have survived without all the help I got from Target Dayton!"

We see them hungry,

and in love, we feed them a free hot meal. We see them shivering in the cold, and in love, we clothe them with a winter coat. We see them hopeless, and in love, we share the gospel with them and lead them to Christ! "It's a huge project to purchase the hundreds of winter coats we need at a low cost and in the right sizes! Shipments of new winter coats for men, women and children are arriving at Target Dayton every day as we prepare to clothe a thousand poor and homeless people during November.

Brie is a prostitute who is addicted to crack-cocaine. She lives on the street most of the time. She came in from the freezing rain last winter, completely soaked. Cindi gave her some dry clothing, and was able to share Christ with her, and pray for her.

That's why we are here. God put us here for the hundreds of homeless people like Doyle. Doug. And Brie. We are here to feed them, clothe them and lead them to Christ this winter.

Many will do their best to survive this winter in a parking garage. Or an abandoned house. Or even a make-shift tent. But without our help, their chances of survival are not good.
